Bristol Bay Area Health Corporation (BBAHC) has complete medical services including Inpatient Hospital Services and Outpatient Clinic care, 24 hour Emergency Room and Medevac. Additional services are Audiology, Dental, Diabetes, Laboratory, Optometry, Radiology, and Specialty Clinics.

For appointments call 907-842-9369 or 800-478-5201, ask for scheduling.

Audiology

- Services are based at Kakanak Hospital. The audiologist provides a variety of hearing evaluations: neonatal hearing screening; hearing aid evaluations; hearing aid checks and troubleshooting; dispensing hearing aids; and the sale of assistive listening devices.

Behavioral Health Center

For appointments at Behavioral Health, call 907-842-1230 or 800-510-1230

After-hours and weekend emergency calls are dispatched to counselors by Dillingham Police at (907) 842-5354.

- **Substance Use Disorder Outreach:** Crisis intervention and referrals are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to all of the Bristol Bay area.
- **Child Advocacy Center:** We provide a child friendly facility where personnel from many agencies (law enforcement, social workers, mental health, and medical providers) meet to coordinate investigations of possible child abuse.
- **Children Services:** Therapists assist clients with problem-solving in the areas of experiencing sadness, fear, worry, anxiety, behavior, communication, and managing emotional problems.

Dental

- Services provided include comprehensive examinations, same day walk-in emergency care, preventative treatment, dental hygiene (teeth cleanings and non-surgical gum treatments), restorative treatment (crowns, bridges, fillings, partial dentures and complete dentures), oral surgery and limited root canal therapy treatments.

Inpatient Hospital Services

- The Inpatient Department provides services from birth to end-of-life care. The professional staff includes Registered Nurses and Physicians.
- Complete knowledge in Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS), Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS), Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS), Maternal-Fetal Monitoring and Aeromedical Training will serve you in your time of need.

Emergency Room

- The Emergency Room (ER) is a designated Level IV Trauma Center with state of the art equipment.
- ER provides an active Sexual Assault Response Team that provides support and forensic exams for victims of Sexual Assault.
- A Certified Air Ambulance Service for the region is in place to transport critical cases. The Air Ambulance Medical Escorts include RNs, EMTs and occasionally Physicians in that the team is tailored to meet the needs of the patient who is being transported.

Outpatient

- The Community Health Center Outpatient Clinic provides prenatal care, well care of newborns, children, adolescents, men and women and older adults.
- We diagnose and treat many illnesses, injuries and also perform minor procedures. We offer a full range of primary care services including: Acute and chronic disease management, Preventive care, Immunizations, School Physicals, Cardiac Event Monitoring, Halter Monitoring, Colonoscopy, EGD (esophageal duodenoscopy), and ETT (electrocardiac treadmill test). Specialty Clinic services such as Cardiology, ENT, Ortho, and OB/GYN, are also provided.

Laboratory

- Provides Clinical Laboratory services to Hospital Inpatients, Hospital Emergency Department patients, Outpatients and village clinic patients. Medical Technologists are in-house or on call 24/7.

Medical Imaging

- Medical Imaging Services (MIS) provides comprehensive Diagnostic Medical Imaging to all residence of the Bristol Bay Region. BBAHC maintains high standards by using state-of-the-art digital diagnostic equipment and procedures that allows your test result turnaround time to be much faster and more reliable.
- Those services include: Computerized Radiography (CR), Diagnostic Ultrasound (US), Digital Mammography, and Computerized Tomography (CT)
- Services are available from 9:00 am to 6:00 PM, Monday through Friday. Emergency services are provided 24/7.

Optometry

- Service providing diagnosis and management of a variety of eye diseases, as well as providing routine eye exams for children and adults.

Pharmacy

- Services are provided to patients seen in the walk-in clinic or in the village clinics.
- Pharmacists are available to provide information to patients regarding medications.
- There is a pharmacist devoted to caring for patients admitted to the hospital and is also available 24/7 for inpatient services.

Physical Therapy

- Physical Therapists (PTs) examine each individual and develop a treatment plan using skilled techniques to promote the ability to move, reduce pain, restore function, and prevent disability.
- Please see your medical provider to determine if your symptoms would benefit from physical therapy evaluation and treatment.

Diabetes Community Wellness Program

- The Diabetes Community Wellness Program is committed to increasing diabetes awareness within the Bristol Bay Area. The program provides diabetes education to individuals with Pre-diabetes and diabetes (Type 1, Type 2, and Gestational).
- The goal is to provide individuals with the knowledge and skills necessary for diabetes self-management and to empower and encourage behavioral changes for optimal health outcomes and improved quality of life.

Nutritional Counseling Services

- Provided by a Registered Dietician, comprehensive services include nutritional assessment, nutritional counseling and education, specialty diets, food preparation and diabetes management.

Health Education Services

- Promotes community and individual health through a variety of outreach and educational programs listed below.

WIC (Women, Infants and Children)

- Supplemental food program providing nutritious foods and nutrition education to pregnant and breastfeeding women, infants and children up to age five who meet income and nutritional eligibility requirements.

ILP (Infant Learning Program)

- Structured, individualized skills development program for children, birth to 3 years old, who may be experience developmental delays.

Tobacco Prevention and Cessation Program

- Certified Tobacco Treatment Specialists facilitate tobacco prevention education and cessation assistance including individual counseling, medication therapy and continued support.


- Provides low rental subsidies for 277 homes and apartments, and 25 elderly apartments.

- Provides affordable housing for over 400 households in the region.

Community Services Department

Village Public Safety Officer Program842-5257

Under State contract and oversight, to provide law enforcement, emergency medical response, search & rescue, fire prevention and suppression, safety education and accident prevention services.

Tribal Government Services842-5257

Provides technical assistance to tribes participating in the Compact in addition to flowing through funds for tribal administration and office expenses, maintains BBNA's website and conducts ongoing Information Management Research. Pass through Johnson O'Malley funds.

Bristol Bay Re-Entry Program.....842-5257

This voluntary program offers Case Management, Supportive Services, and referrals to those citizens returning to the Bristol Bay Region from correctional facilities. Individuals who have served over 30 days and are within 90 days of release; or have been releases within the past six months, are medium to high-risk felony offenders or high-risk misdemeanants are eligible for the Re-Entry Program.

Natural Resources Department

Natural Resources.....842-5257

Provides for research, assessments and advocacy for the protection and continued availability of Natural Resources in Bristol Bay for subsistence through cooperative agreements and submission of proposals to regulatory agencies.

Browns Field.....842-5257

Coordinates with Tribes, State, Federal agencies to promote re-development of contaminated sites throughout Bristol Bay.

Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Indian General Assistance Program.....842-5257

Provides for an assessment of environmental needs and concerns of Bristol Bay tribes.

Eskimo Walrus Commission.....842-5257

Very small grant to provide funding for the Qayassiq Walrus Commission to oversee the fall walrus hunt on Round Island.

Subsistence Partners for Fisheries Monitoring Program.....842-5257

Works with Bristol Bay Tribes, subsistence fishers and resources managers to identify, design and implement research projects that protect subsistence fish resources

U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service.....842-5257

Provides small grants for subsistence studies, river surveys and migratory bird surveys and workshops.

Land Management Department

Land Management Services.....842-5257

Participates with other federal agencies in the Native allotment conveyance process and assist Native allottees' requests for transactions (sales, leases, use permits and probates, etc.). Represent and advocate on behalf of the restricted landowners who have not yet receive title to their land.

Forestry Program.....842-5257

Works with native allotment owners by coordinating with State and Federal agencies as well as other agencies to ensure sustainable forest management, and there is a Fire Preparedness plan to respond to fires affecting trust lands.

Child Development Department



Head Start..... 842-4059

Comprehensive early childhood program for families with children ages 3 to 5 who meet eligibility requirements.

Child Care Center..... 842-6126

Offers full day services and after school care with 3 classrooms. The Child Care center is open from 7:30am to 5:00pm Monday through Friday. The Child Care center operates from the last week of August to through the end of May, which is the same time as public school. Children participate in various activities including; reading, circle time, art activities, dramatic play, and outdoor time.

Workforce Development Center

Child Care Development Block Grant.....1-888-285-2262

Pays for childcare, whether provided by friends, family, or licensed care giver. Parents choose their own provider. Requirements are that your children are: Alaskan Native descendants, employed, and or attending classes, or in employment training, or engaged in subsistence activities. Amount of assistance is determined on a sliding scale

Employment and Training Services..... 842-2262

Include creating/updating resumes, job searches, employment counseling and interview techniques, working with service partners, employers, and contractors to develop jobs and identify employment needs of the Bristol Bay Region. The Employment and Training programs utilize the Job Service Network and AlexSys Data Base to help bring employees and employers together with jobs around the region and the state. Additional employment-related supportive services are available to eligible individuals, such as short term transportation, grooming, clothing, tools and rental assistance.

Adult Vocational Training Program.....842-2262

Assists student obtain vocational goals.

General Assistance..... 842-2262

Provides short term, basic financial assistance to families or individuals with little or no income who meet the eligibility criteria.

Higher Education..... 842-2262

Provides scholarships to Bristol Bay Alaska Native students to attend college. Can provide financial aid counseling to students.

Vocational Rehabilitation Services..... 842-2262

Assists disabled Alaska Natives with getting or maintaining employment.

Youth Employment Services..... 842-2262

Offers Native youth (14-21) an opportunity to gain classroom training, work experience, and vocational exploration.

Temporary Assistance to Needy Families.....842-2262

Offers monthly cash assistance to income eligible families residing in the Bristol Bay Region. The TANF program has offices in Togiak, Dillingham, Manokotak and New Stuyahok. Adults on TANF are required to complete a family self-sufficiency plan that identifies the barriers and activities the family will participate in. Work activities may include: paid employment, work experience, community service work, traditional activities and other related activities to reach self-sufficiency and end dependence.

Heating Assistance Program.....842-2262

Assists low income qualifying households pay a portion of their heating assistance needs. Income eligible households may receive only one grant per year, which will be paid directly to utility vendors. The Heating Assistance Program works with BBHA and Village Councils to assist low income, eligible households with failed/unsafe heating units by installing new boilers, Toyostoves, and furnaces.

**Children’s Services Division.....842-4139**

The ICWA Program provides for trained caseworkers who perform home studies, perform case management, and assist councils with ICWA case and tribal adoptions.

**Aging and Disabilities Division..... 842-1902**

Provides nutrition and supportive services to elders. Hot lunches are provided for elders 60+ at the school in 13 villages, lunches are delivered to homebound elders 60+ in those villages. Supportive services are offered to elders 60+ and individuals experiencing a disability throughout the region, including assistance with applications for Social Security and Adult Public Assistance, homemaker/chore services, and option counseling. Also files reports of harm with Adult Protective Services.

**Family Violence Prevention Division.....842-4139**

The Family Violence Prevention Division promotes personal safety, healthy families and community wellness in the Bristol Bay region through awareness, prevention and collaboration. The Family Violence Prevention Division collaborates with individuals and agencies to promote wellness through the development of community wellness teams. Teams are designed to address issues of substance abuse, sexual assault, domestic violence, and hunger in Bristol Bay communities.

**Food Bank.....842-3663**

Provides residents of Bristol Bay with emergency food services. The Food Bank is located at the intersection of Kanakanak Road and Wood River Road. Hours of operation are Monday – Friday, 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. – 4:30 p.m. Verification of income is needed to determine eligibility. Services may be accessed once a month

Philosophy Statement

SAFE is committed to every person's right to have power over their own life and to make informed choices whether, when and how to seek or receive services that honor their dignity, sovereignty and sense of self-worth.

Purpose

SAFE is organized for the exclusive purpose of promoting the welfare of victims of domestic violence, sexual assault and other similar (and related emotional) abuse.

Crisis Intervention

A 24-hour toll free crisis line monitored by trained staff and volunteers.

Crisis intervention advocacy (individual) followed up with ongoing support services, referral, and assistance with accessing long-term counseling where applicable.

Advocacy & Accompaniment (Individual) includes medical, public assistance, social services, law enforcement, as well as legal advocacy and assistance with Domestic Violence Protective Orders

Advocates provide safety planning including transportation to the shelter and medical, legal, and social services.

Immediate Safety/Shelter

A 16-bed shelter in Dillingham for women and their children who are victims of domestic violence and/or sexual assault or whose homes/living arrangements are unsafe due to violence and/or related abuse.

We maintain a safe home network and alternative emergency housing for adult male victims and as a backup for the shelter.

Emergency transportation for victim, children and/or other family members to nearest safe shelter and for immediate medical, legal and social service needs.

Sexual Assault Victim Services

SAFE participates in the coordinated response to adult victims of sexual assault, known as SART (Sexual Assault Response Team), and assists the Nitaput Child Advocacy Center (CAC) with services to child victims.

Victims can contact SAFE, BBAHC/Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner, Nitaput CAC, and/or local or state law enforcement. Anyone can contact these agencies to report known or suspected sexual assault, or to learn what services are available and how to access them. Victims of sexual assault may contact SAFE directly for assistance in accessing confidential support services. SAFE services are available regardless if victim(s) want to make a police report. SAFE is a mandatory reporter of child and elder abuse.

SISTR Support Group

SISTRS support groups are open to the public and held every Thursday evening from 5pm to 7pm. Groups meet in the SISTRS room at the SAFE building. Dinner is provided. Taxi vouchers can be provided for transportation to and from the group. For more information, call the SAFE office.

Direct Services

SAFE believes that every door should be the right door when people are seeking help. Our direct services staff is key to making this happen for SAFE. Direct Services Advocates primarily work with people who have experienced interpersonal violence in getting the help they need whether it is from SAFE or other agencies.

Secondarily we help anyone who comes to us needing help find the services they need.

Provides legal information, referral and advocacy to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. Services include assistance to adult and child victims in obtaining Domestic Violence Restraining Orders, court accompaniment, and advocacy with various agencies involved in legal proceedings. Many services can be provided telephonically. SAFE also operates a daily court watch and tribal notification program linking tribes, villages and regional groups with updated information.

Victims of domestic violence/sexual assault and other crimes may pick up crime compensation forms at the SAFE office. Staff can provide assistance in completing these forms and accessing VCC.

System Advocacy is when an Advocate speaks with or works with another agency on behalf of (and with permission from) a person seeking services, to assist the other agency to better respond to the needs of the individual being served as well as others who may be in similar situations now or in the future.

Outreach and Education

SAFE provides community education on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault, including Personal Safety for children K-12. Sessions on family violence issues are provided periodically and also on request. SAFE's Village Services will make every effort to meet any village request for a presentation within travel fund constraints. Will also provide reference materials on request. Staff coordinate professional trainings on domestic violence, sexual assault, child abuse & neglect, sexual harassment and related subjects for law enforcement, educators, tribal and village leaders, members of the faith community, businesses, and other human service providers.

Outreach and Education staff also work on community collaboration and Host CANDU and CJA meetings
CANDU (Community Action Network Directed Upstream) -is an informal, community wide group of people and agencies looking at primary prevention strategies focused on strengthening the protective factors in our community that foster wellness.

Community Justice Alliance – CJA is an informal group of people and agencies involved with the criminal, civil, community justice system

Youth Services

SAFE Houses the MYSPACE Youth Wellness Center open Monday through Friday from 3pm to 9 pm for youth in the Middle School or High School age range. Tutoring is available every evening and dinner is served each night. There are opportunities for leadership as well as community involvement.

SAFE co facilitates Summer Youth Services a partnership of various entities to provide a cultural activity based summer day camp for elementary and middle school aged children.

The giant steps forward in the community-building process are taken by those individuals of such courage that they are able to risk speaking at a level of vulnerability and authenticity at which no one in the group has spoken before.

- Reportable infectious disease investigation and contact notification

Public Health Nursing services available for community:

- Advocate for the development of policies and plans that support individual and community health promoting efforts.

- Research for new insights and innovative solutions to health problems.

Public Health Nurses form the "public health safety net" throughout Alaska. Public health nurse time is spent in a combination of individual, family, community, and agency activities. Client services are mostly to rural and low income and/or under insured individuals and families. More than 50% of our services are provided to children under 5 years of age and to pregnant women and adolescents. Alaska's Public Health Nursing serves as a conduit of information between multiple state and local agencies and the public in their communities on a wide range of public health concerns.

The Alaska State Violent Crimes Compensation Board provides compensation to innocent victims of violent crime who have reported the crime to police. Can provide reimbursement of lost wages, financial support for dependents of deceased crime victims, transportation costs, dental expenses, medical expenses including counseling for both primary and secondary victims (i.e. children who witness the murder of a parent), and other losses caused by the crime. Will not provide compensation for property damage.

**ALASKA TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM** – Cash and medical assistance for low-income families. Families with children under 19 or pregnant women in their third trimester may qualify when at least one parent is working less than 100 hours a month, too ill to work, absent or deceased.

**FOOD STAMPS** – Food coupons for low-income households for the purchase of food.

**GENERAL RELIEF** – Emergency assistance for low income individuals who are homeless, facing eviction, or have received a utility cut-off notice. This program may also help pay first month’s rent for a new place to live. Assistance is given on a month-to-month basis - - applicants must reapply each month.

**GENERAL RELIEF MEDICAL** – Provides emergency medical assistance for individuals, 21 years of age or older and under age 65 who have received or need emergency hospitalization or who have certain life threatening or chronic illnesses.



SAFE – Provides emergency air fair to victims of domestic violence/sexual assault and their families when remaining in the village is unsafe. Transportation is provided only one-way, and the only to the Shelter. SAFE also provides local transportation to clients in limited circumstances. 842-2320

BBNA Family Services – Wheelchair accessible van for client transport. Limited air transportation for village clients. 842-4139

Bristol Bay Counseling Center – Provides emergency air transportation to clients in a mental health crisis, as determined by the program. Also provides local transportation to clients in limited circumstances. 842-1230

BBAHC Social Services – Arranges some transportation expenses for Medicaid recipients, and may be able to authorize expenses for low-income patients who must travel to receive necessary medical services. 842-9338.

## Village Councils and Other Resources

Some Village Councils have established Tribal Courts. Several Village Councils in the Bristol Bay region provide some child welfare services. All have the authority to do so. Some Village Councils can provide food, clothing, and other assistance for village residents. Village Councils can authorize adoptions of Tribal members. Some Village Councils have or are establishing Village Safe Homes for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault including children. Check with your local Village Council to find out what services they offer.
