## Our Vision

## Who is Eligible?

- ◆ Individuals who have served over 30 days and are within 90 days of release; or have been released within the past 6 months.
- ◆ Medium to High-Risk Felony Offenders.
- ◆ High-Risk Misdemeanants.

## What does the Reentry Program offer?

- ◆ Case Management
- ◆ Supportive Services (Assistance with: Housing; transportation; ID, social security card, drivers license; Work clothing.)
- ◆ Referrals to partnering agencies
- ◆ Guidance to self-sufficiency.



## The Expectation of Participants?

Full participation from the Reentrant is essential. Working together with the Caseworker, and regional partner agencies to strive for self-sufficiency to achieve successful and lasting reentry into the community. This is a volunteer program, participants can choose to leave the program at anytime.



## Program duration:

Program duration is limited to 3 months pre-release and 6 months post release.



### Referral: Pre-Release

Referral from post-release to Case Management 90 days to release.

### In-Reach: Pre-Release

Caseworker meets with participant and starts the application process and works on transitional support needs while incarcerated.

### Transition Plan 1: Post Release Months 1-2

Caseworker has several meetings with Reentrant post release on transitional support needs and provides referrals to providers.



### Transition Plan 2: Post Release Months 3-4

Caseworker has meetings as needed with Reentrant to secure services, needed providers and increase community supports.




### Transition Plan 3: Post-Release Months 4-6

Caseworker has meetings with Reentrant to continue self-sufficiency needs and community supports.

### After Care Plan: Program Completion At 6 months

Case Manager works with Reentrant to create a plan for independently maintaining self-sufficiency.
