

COVID - 19 PANDEMIC TRAVEL PLAN & PROTOCOLS FOR
 FY 2020 COMMERCIAL FISHING VESSELS (Fleet Plan)

For Chignik Lagoon Village Council

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<p>Purpose</p>	<p>This travel plan and protocol is agreed to by the signatory fishing businesses listed in Appendix A, which operate in and around Chignik Lagoon. The purpose of this plan and protocol is to comply with Public Health Disaster Emergency Declaration Nos. 11 and 12 signed on March 11, 2020 by Governor Michael Dunleavy, as well as Chignik Lagoon Village Ordinance 2020-03-30. These actions prohibit the entry of any person into Chignik Lagoon from another community except to support critical infrastructure or for critical personal needs in order to prevent introduction of the COVID-19 virus to Chignik Lagoon, or to slow, and otherwise disrupt the spread of the virus.</p> <p>Commercial fishing is an essential business activity in Chignik Lagoon and is exempt from the travel restrictions, <u>HOWEVER, critical infrastructure industries must, to the extent reasonably feasible, take reasonable care to protect their staff and operations during this pandemic provided that the employers avoid the spread of COVID-19 and not endanger the lives of the communities in which the industries operate, of others who serve as a part of that infrastructure, or the ability of that critical infrastructure to function.</u></p> <p>Under Mandates Nos. 11 and 12, critical infrastructure businesses must submit a travel plan or protocol for maintaining critical infrastructure to the State. The signatory businesses listed in Appendix A, hereby agree to these travel plans and protocols and cooperatively submit this plan and protocol to the State as required by the mandates. The Tribal Administrator shall file this plan and any amendments with akcovidplans@ak-prepared.com.</p>
<p>Scope</p>	<p>This travel plan and protocol covers all crew working for a signatory fishing business, and includes those individuals working directly as a subcontractor to a signatory fishing business. This plan does not apply to any business which is not a signatory.</p>
<p>Definitions</p>	<p>The following are defined by Center for Disease Control and</p>

Prevention and/or World Health Organization (WHO):

Boat Captain.

The term “boat captain” shall include boat owners.

Confirmed COVID-19:

A person who has tested positive for COVID-19.

Suspect COVID-19:

A person who presents signs and symptoms for COVID-19, which at a minimum includes a body temperature of 100.4 F° and/or a persistent dry cough.

Close Contact:

Greater than 15 minutes face-to-face contact in any setting with a confirmed case in the period extending from 24 hours before onset of symptoms in the confirmed case, or sharing of a closed space with a confirmed case for a prolonged period (e.g. more than 2 hours) in the period extending from 24 hours before onset of symptoms in the confirmed case. A close contact includes a person meeting any of the following criteria:

Crews serving on the same fishing vessel,

Living in the same household or household-like setting (e.g.in a boarding school or hostel, apartment, etc.).

Direct contact with the body fluids or laboratory specimens of a case without recommended PPE or failure of PPE.

Aircraft passengers who were seated in the same row as the case, or in the two rows in front or two rows behind a confirmed COVID-19 case.

Contact needs to have occurred within the period extending 24 hours before onset of symptoms in the case until the case is classified as no longer infectious by the treating team.

Note that healthcare workers and other contacts who have taken recommended infection control precautions, including the use of full PPE, while caring for a symptomatic confirmed COVID-19 case are not considered to be close contacts.

Isolation:

	<p>Separating people from the general population of Chignik Lagoon to see if they become sick. Isolation may be with other immediate family members or members of the same crew, provided that such family members or members of the same crew shall isolate for the applicable period of isolation.</p> <p><u>Quarantine:</u> Separating individuals who were in close contact, present signs and symptoms of COVID-19, or have tested positive for COVID 19 from people who are not sick. This may require separating such individuals from other family and/or crew members.</p> <p><u>Signs & Symptoms:</u> Fever over 100.4F° persistent cough, and may include sore throat, shortness of breath, chills, body aches, headache, abdominal pain, diarrhea, and vomiting.</p> <p><u>Testing:</u> Approved testing shall include rapid testing.</p>
Effective Date	04/10/20 until further notice.
Crew Lists/Travel Authorization	At least two (2) days prior to arranging for crew traveling to Chignik Lagoon by air or vessel, each boat captain or business owner shall file a complete crew list with the Chignik Lagoon Tribal Administrator. The Tribal Administrator shall only issue permission to air carriers to transport crew to Chignik Lagoon if such crew is named on such crew lists, and the Capitan has certified compliance with applicable preventative controls stated below.
Basic Controls (in Village)	<p>Boat Captains shall implement the following controls for all crew while crew is in Chignik Lagoon:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) ensure crew have/use hand sanitizers, face protection and gloves. 2) encourage all crew to wash hands regularly. 3) take temperatures of all crew at least twice a day and report any body temperature over 100.4 F.° to the Village Health Aide. 4) Maintain distances of +6' from all other persons outside of vessels, crew shacks or an individual's private residence. 5) Avoid unnecessary social interaction, and limit travel within the village to necessary business activities. <p>Boat captains shall confine crew to vessels, crew shacks or an individual crew member's private residence when not engaged in necessary business activities that require being in public places in Chignik Lagoon.</p>
Operational	<u>Sanitation Levels:</u>

<p>Controls (in Village)</p>	<p>Quarantine of crew Confirmed/Suspect COVID-19 crew (i.e. close contact, present signs and symptoms of COVID-19, or have tested positive for COVID 19)</p> <p>Sanitation levels do not apply to any crew member who has tested negative for COVID 19, Provided that such crew is not housed with crew that is subject to isolation or quarantine.</p> <p>Sanitation levels do not apply to any crew member who has previously contracted COVID 19 and recovered,</p> <p><u>Job Site Cleanliness.</u> All job sites sanitized daily</p> <p><u>Meetings:</u> All meetings with non-crew members will be via electronic means</p> <p><u>Physical/Social Distancing:</u> All crew shall maintain distances of +6' from others and avoid unnecessary social interaction while on shore in the village unless in quarantine or isolation or residing in crew shacks or an individual crew member's private residence.</p>
<p>Preventive Controls (in Village)</p>	<p><u>Screening Practice / All Crew:</u> All crew shall undergo temperature screening and visual evaluation for dry cough prior to departing from another Alaskan community bound for Chignik Lagoon. The Boat Capitan shall certify that no crew member manifested a temperature in excess of 100.4 F° in such screening to the Tribal Administrator prior to departure Chignik Lagoon.</p> <p>Upon arrival in Chignik Lagoon, all crew shall undergo temperature screening and visual evaluation for dry cough by person appointed by Council.</p> <p><u>Isolation Practice/ In-State Crew.</u> Upon arrival in Chignik Lagoon, crew members traveling from another Alaskan community shall proceed directly to their residences, crew shacks, or vessel. Non-resident crew shall not disembark from the vessel or leave the crew shack except for provisioning, refueling off-loading catch, fish tickets, refueling, or other preparations for fishing activity.</p> <p><u>Isolation Practice/ Out-of-State Crew (Mandate No. 4):</u> Any employee that is required to enter Alaska from out-of-state</p>

	<p>as a part of the critical path to Chignik Lagoon will isolate for 14 days in a residence, crew shack, or onboard vessel. Such employee will check twice daily for any signs and symptoms and record temperature. Once 14-day quarantine has elapsed. The boat captain shall certify that such crew member did not manifest a temperature in excess of 100.4 F° in such screening to the Tribal Administrator and compliance with above travel protocol. For Crew traveling to Chignik Lagoon on a vessel, the days aboard the vessel in transit from the last port of call prior to arrival in Chignik Lagoon shall be credited as as isolation day. After the completion of isolation, non-resident crew shall not disembark from the vessel or leave the crew shack except for provisioning, refueling off-loading catch, fish tickets, refueling, or other preparations for fishing activity</p>
On Vessel	<p><u>Mandate 17</u> The Vessel shall comply with State Mandate 17.</p>
Enforcement	<p><u>Administrative Reporting:</u> The Tribal Administrator shall report all mandate violations and actions not in compliance with this plan to investigations@alaska.gov.</p> <p><u>State Court:</u> Tribal Employees authorized under AS 18. 65.010 may issue citations into State Court for mandate violations and non-compliance with this plan under A.S. 26.23.020.</p> <p><u>Tribal Court:</u> Tribal Employees authorized by Council Resolution may issue citations to Tribal Court for violations of Tribal law that also violate State Mandates and non-compliance with this plan.</p>
